- 1.1 To provide an update of progress against the current year's (2015/16) Place Board Work Plan.

2. Background

- 2.1 Earlier this year the Local Area Plan's priorities associated with Place were referred to the Washington Place Board to action on behalf of the Area Committee. The Place Board continue to initiate action on those priorities and **Annex 1** outlines progress to date.

3 Area Governance Arrangements

- 3.1 The Area Committees are part of the Council's Executive Function and have two key roles:-
- a. Influencing decisions on services delivered at a local level; and
 - b. Identification of key priorities for their areas, in the context of supporting the delivery of the Council's Corporate Outcomes Framework at a local level and ensures maximum impact where necessary through utilising its own resources.
- 3.2 Area Place and People Boards were set up to support the Area Committee in identifying areas of priority and ensure action in line with those priorities.
- 3.3 Each ward has one elected member representative, whose role it is to liaise with their ward colleagues in between meetings and feedback collective views into the Board meetings. Members will work alongside key officers in what will be practical action orientated groups. It should be noted that the Board is not a decision making body and the work / recommendations of the Board will be presented to the Area Committees for final endorsement. This is to address issues such as time required to facilitate discussions with potential lead agents (and community groups), ensure priority events are identified in order to confirm scheduling and programming at the beginning of each year – this to include which of the ‘bigger events’ AC wish to see continue and what level of support is required, and also a more planned approach for the smaller events – such as Durham Miners Gala, Remembrance, other commemorative events etc. – including agreeing funding source, level of support etc. The area committee to also consider how to build on the proposed ‘business approach’ to encourage more resources for Washington events from external sources. • Aligning funds now will allow a more planned approach with the process of working via a Place board sub group to draft the programme and methodology in January 2016. • Proposal to align £50,000 SIB 2015/16 for the Events 2016 programme to be considered under Item 6 Finance Report
