1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 To consider an application for the grant of a premises licence for the above-mentioned premises.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed save as below

1. Any person exercising a security activity (as defined in paragraph 2(1)(a) of Schedule 2 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001) shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority
2. Such a person will be employed at the premises at the discretion of the designated premises supervisor/holder of the Premises Licence.
3. Any persons as defined in condition 1 will clearly display his name badge at all times whilst on duty.
4. No customers apparently carrying open bottles upon entry shall be admitted to the premises at any time the premises are open to the public.
5. Alcoholic and other drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers save for consumption in any external area provided for that purpose.
6. A CCTV system must be designed installed and maintained in proper working order to the satisfaction of the Council and Northumbria Police. Such a system must:
 - 6.1 ensure coverage of all entrances and exits to the premises both internally and externally
 - 6.2 provide continuous recording facilities for each camera to a good standard of clarity. Such recordings must be retained for a period of 28 days and must be supplied to an Officer of the Council or Northumbria Police on request.
 - 6.3 be in operation at all times the premises are in use
7. No persons must be allowed to leave the premises whilst in possession of any drinking vessel or open bottle, whether empty or containing any beverage.
8. All members of staff at the premises shall seek credible photographic proof of age evidence from any person who appears to be under the age of 21 years and who is seeking access to the premises, or is seeking to purchase or consume alcohol.

c) Public safety

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed save as below

1. To comply with the reasonable requirements of the fire officer from time to time
2. To comply with the reasonable requirements of the building control officer

d) The prevention of public nuisance

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed save as below

1. Clear and legible notices must be displayed at all exits and other circulatory areas requesting patrons to leave the premises quietly having regard to the needs of local residents.
2. Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.

OBJECTION TO DRINKS LICENCE FOR
NE 38 SPORTS BAR (PREVIOUS BANSTON CLUB)

As a prelude:- I have lived in Banston Village with my wife since it was built over 30 yrs ago. Despite its unsavoury reputation in some quarters I find it pleasant. I own my own residence & was a member of Banston Club years ago when it had a committee & was "ruined" by my mismanagement.

Prevention of Crime & Disorder

This building is dilapidated & has gained the reputation generally under the previous management of being a "seedy drinking den" - if not other irreputable activities. Drink Driving (A case), Fighting & Disorderly Behaviour plus broken bottles & litter were common - including condoms. Patrons were even urinating in gardens.

I cannot see how NE 38 Sports Bar being any different. I wasn't aware that Sporting Activities required a bar - in fact just the opposite. I don't believe the main activity will be sport.

I would remind the Licensing Authority that the owner of this building owns or did own the Football Club in Washington. It had nothing to do with football but was a seedy night club which burnt down

Yorants in the area have fed up with the drunken behaviour & have had Police involvement.

Barmston Village doesn't want this situation. This "new enterprise" will attract back all the seedy characters & alcoholics the Police managed to eliminate. This is being proposed at a time when massive cuts are taking place in police numbers.

Prevention of Children from harm

Barmston has a large school & a nursery not 200 yards away from what is proposed to be "NS 38 Sports Bar". Behaviour of the type previously indicated is not the example reasonable people would teach. The children would be exposed to some unsavoury characters in their general movements besides exposure to dangerous vehicles.

Public Safety

Increased activity at a bus link where one approaches from the shops is "blind" will increase the risk of serious injury to a pedestrian.

This is enhanced by the increasing wish by drivers to travel at speed through the bus link - besides buses & public service vehicles.

General

- 1) This building was earmarked for demolition along with the flat & covered shop. A new shop was to be built on the car park & the area was to be spiced up & made attractive. Has this changed? The building hasn't been used for years. The roof has been felted - apparently still leaks & the roof felt at the front is exposed for a length of 10ft x 3ft depth (approximately). I doubt the interior is fit for public use.

also there has been no evidence of trademark activity
Have Health & Safety & the Fire Service been involved?

2) Does this business fit in with our local council's
forward plans. In the new proximity there is a
church, doctors surgery & pharmacy & an old people's
home.

A shop (probably in the precinct) is to be built
on the council car park. With these changes &

It has been brought to our attention that an application has been made for a license or the premises of the former Barmston Club to reopen as a sports bar.

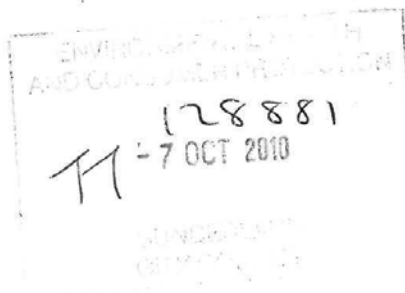
I must express, on behalf of my husband and myself, our extreme opposition to this.

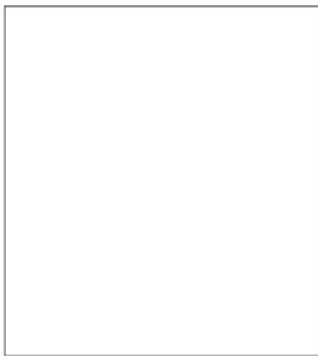
