1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the grant of a premises licence for the above-mentioned premises.

The applicant has also requested that the hours be extended until 00:30 on Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday at Bank Holiday weekends, Christmas Eve, Boxing Day and from 10:00 on New Year's Eve until the proposed terminal hour on New Year's Day. 
It has been brought to our attention that an application has been made for a license or the premises of the former Barmston Club to reopen as a sports bar.


I must express, on behalf of my husband and myself, our extreme opposition to this.

Firstly, I would say that this venue is in the middle of a residential area, and whereas Barmston Club was a licensed property it was only for the sale of alcohol within normal licensing hours. Added to this the site is within close proximity to a school and nursery, a place of worship, and a care home for the elderly. If this is given a green light, it will bring increased traffic to the village centre, with all the parking problems that entails, and will increase rowdy and disruptive behaviour at
