#### **Report of the City Solicitor**

#### 1. Purpose of Report

1.1 To provide Council with a summary of the operation of the Health & Well-Being Review Committee in 2007/08.

#### 2. Background

2.1 To aid transparency and business planning, Review Committees operate to an annual work programme agreed at the beginning of each year. Additional meetings/reports are added as necessary. In total 59 reports were presented in 2007/08, over 11 meetings, divided into the following 8 categories. All presentations have been listed under the relevant category:

#### 3. Highlights from 2007/08

#### **Policy Review**

- 3.1 A study was undertaken this year into commissioning in social care. The landscape of health and social care is changing rapidly and in order to meet the challenges ahead the Committee agreed to examine the commissioning cycle in order to identify strengths and weaknesses and recommend improvements.
- 3.2 Research consisted of a number of interviews, focus groups, a community event and an expert jury event. Internal staff, external organisations, service users, carers and the general public were all given the opportunity to comment. Recommendations made were based on the evidence heard by the Committee.

#### **Mental Health**

3.3 Cherry Knowle became the focus of much scrutiny this year. This began with the closure of the Beeches Ward and the failure of NTW to inform the Committee in the appropriate way. The Committee was attended by numerous members of the public specifically to hear this item. This led to a number of reports, visits to the site and the Committee referred the issue by letter to the Secretary of State.

#### **Smoke Free England**

3.4 The Committee heard two updates about the changes to laws on smoking in public places. It was reported that the city is progressing well with the changes and there has been much support from the public and from the owners of establishments affected by the changes.

#### **North East Health Strategy**

3.5 The Committee had the opportunity to comment on the draft version of the regional health and well-being strategy, the first of its kind in the region.

#### **Local Involvement Networks**

3.6 This year Local Involvement Networks (LINks) were announced as the replacement for Patient and Public Involvement Forums. The local authority is responsible for procuring the host organisation that will set up and administer the LINk. The Committee heard regular progress updates and in March 2008 the host organisation was chosen.

#### **NHS Healthcheck**

3.7 In July, 2005, the Healthcare Commission published a new NHS performance framework based on 24 core standards in 7 domains of: Safety, Clinical & Cost Effectiveness, Governance, Patient Focus, Accessible & Responsive Care, Care Environment and Amenities and Public Health. Boards of Trusts complete a self-evaluation template. OSCs are invited to submit comments to provide 'a reality check'. A more streamlined approach to this report was taken in 2007/08 and Members were keen to repeat this next year.

#### **Vision for Adult Services**

3.8 Health, Housing and Adult Services (HHAS) made a number of presentations about their service provision and the progress that has been made. Members heard about the progress of Extra Care facilities and that the first development is currently underway. Direct Payments are more widely used now and are continuing to develop. The new Director of the HHAS Directorate informed Members of his vision and his plans for a 15-year strategy. Members were pleased with the progress that has been made.

#### **Nookside**

3.9 A report of the Nookside Working Group was presented to the Committee and attracted numerous members of the public. In 2007 changes had been implemented to the provision of day opportunities. After concerns about the implementation process voiced at the Health and Well-Being Review Committee, a working group was set up in 2007 at the request of the Leader to review the implementation process. The Committee was pleased with the progress that had been made and approved the recommendations made by the working group and requested quarterly updates.

#### 4. Conclusion

4.1 The Committee has delivered an ambitious work programme in 2007/08. Positive feedback has been received on how the significant powers of health scrutiny are being progressed. The Audit Commission reported in the Council's Corporate Assessment that the Health and Well-Being Review Committee was delivering strong scrutiny, noting particularly strong review in relation to mental health issues. 2007/08 was another year of change for the NHS and social care. Effective planning has enabled consideration of all issues Members wished to look at.

## 5. Recommendation

5.1 Council is asked to consider the operation, achievements and impact of the committee during 2007/08.
