

MEETING: 21 NOVEMBER 2011**SUBJECT: LGA ANNUAL FIRE CONFERENCE - 20th AND 21st MARCH 2012****REPORT OF THE CHIEF FIRE OFFICER**

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The fifteenth Annual Fire Conference of the Local Government Association (LGA) is scheduled to be held in Bournemouth on the 20th and 21st March 2012. This report proposes an Authority representation at the conference.

2. LGA ANNUAL FIRE CONFERENCE 2012

- 2.1 The LGA Annual Fire Conference is the key conference of the year for fire and rescue authorities as it deals with issues of direct concern to the fire and rescue service as a whole.
- 2.2 This year, the conference will be held at the Highcliff Marriott Hotel, Bournemouth on the 20th and 21st March 2012 and the theme of the conference will centre on resilience. This theme has been planned to address the issues the key challenges facing the service in the coming months and years.
- 2.3 Against this backdrop conference sessions will explore a range of issues including topics such as the potential for introducing radically different approaches to the delivery of services as well as specific practical topics such as how to improve sickness management and the potential for sharing back office functions.
- 2.4 Speakers will be drawn from fire and rescue services, fire and rescue authorities, central government and other key organisations and it is envisaged that an address from the Fire Minister, Bob Neill MP will be made. In addition, there will also be a number of breakout and plenary sessions available, with opportunities to question speakers on the issues put forward at the conference.
- 2.5 It is envisaged that there will be a strong attendance from members and officers of fire and rescue authorities as well as key figures from central government, which will provide an ideal opportunity to further develop an understanding of the emerging issues.

3. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 3.1 The cost of the conference is £360 per person for LGA member authorities, held at 2008 prices, which covers the main conference and workshop sessions and these costs can be met from within the existing budget.
- 3.2 The Chief Fire Officer proposes that, in line with past procedure, the Chairman, Vice-Chairman and one other member of the Authority be nominated to attend.

4. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 4.1 The Authority is recommended to approve the attendance of the Chairman, Vice-Chairman and one Member at the LGA Fire Conference;
