1.0 PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

1.1 To consider an application received from Mrs. Emma Clark for grant of consent to trade in a designated area in respect of a site situated opposite the junction of the back lane between Stobart Street and Brooke Street, Sheepfold Industrial Estate, Sunderland.

2.0 DESCRIPTION OF DECISION (RECOMMENDATION)

2.1 The Committee is recommended to give consideration to the grant or refusal of Mrs. Clark's application for grant of consent to trade in a designated area under the terms of Schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982.

3.0 INTRODUCTION/BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The site has been designated by the Council as a consent street for street trading purposes under Part III and Schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982. The Council has discretion to grant such consent "if it thinks fit". Members are therefore entitled to refuse the application should they consider it appropriate to do so.
- 3.2 The application is to trade any day upon which a football game is to be played at the Stadium of Light. The proposed hours of trading are five hours before kick off and two hour after the end of the game.
- 3.3 The applicant has indicated that the site is proposed to be used for the sale of hot food and drinks.

4.0 CURRENT POSITION

4.1 Members may recall that they considered an application for street trading consents in this location at their meeting on 29 September 2008.
