

1. Northumbria Police - Neighbourhood Teams

1.1 Neighbourhood Teams changes occur regularly as a result of internal moves and the attachment indicates the latest list available.

1.2 With regard to other potential moves within the Neighbourhood Teams it is difficult to comment on at the moment as the final decisions are yet to be made, however the roles that have been identified as suitable to come under the CSO umbrella have a specific function, which are different to the current CSO roles. For example, Custody Investigating Officers may be known as CSO Investigation Officers with their specific function being to investigate. Their visibility within the community will take the form of investigating crimes in the community. The same is potentially going to be the same for Offender Managers, their title may be changed and their visibility will be in the community when they are managing offenders out in the community. These decisions have not been formally taken.

2. Extra Funding Operation Guidance

2.1 The Operation commenced on 17th of July and will run until the first week of September 2009. It is easy to measure the results of the Operation with regards to basic data, arrests etc, the more difficult measures are around confidence, this will be measured at the end.

2.2 Back on the Map commissioned a survey of 100 residents prior to the Operation and will survey 100 more at its conclusion, the results of that will be published and will hopefully show an increase in public confidence and a decrease in the fear of crime. Below indicates the more easier measures.

- A total of 102 hours of extra patrols have been conducted in our hotspot areas
- 11 arrests have been made including a number of key offenders
- 15 incidents have been attended
- 29 stop and searches carried out
- 6 licensed premises visits
- 79 items of intelligence
- 12 items of alcohol seized.

2.3 The crime figures are for the NDC area and are a direct comparison against the same period last year.

Dates from 1st April 09 to 7th August 09 as compared with 08.
