**SUBJECT: NATIONAL FIRE STATISTICS 2014-15** 

# REPORT OF THE CHIEF FIRE OFFICER, CHIEF EXECUTIVE AND CLERK TO THE AUTHORITY

### 1 PURPOSE

1.1 This report introduces provides an overview of national fire statistics covering the period 2014-15. The statistics will be presented in the form of a presentation.

### 2 PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT REPORT

- 2.1 Fire and Rescue Services are required to regularly submit data to the Department for Communities and Local Government to allow the production of national fire statistics (Fire Statistics Monitor) on an annual basis. FRAs also send data to the Chartered Institute of Public Finance Accounting (CIPFA) which allows the production of annual reports on FRS resources.
- 2.2 Data contained within these publications is always backward looking and the current reports cover the whole year 2014-15. CIPFA statistics also include estimates for the current financial year.
- 2.3 National fire statistics are useful in benchmarking performance including use of resources. They are used by various agencies including Government and auditors in this regard. TWFRA believes that benchmarking is a key facet of understanding performance, and also includes benchmarking data from the Metropolitan FRS in regular performance reports where this is available.
- 2.4 Officers will present a high level account of national fire statistics at the meeting.
