HIGHWAY MAINTENANCE PROGRAMME 2013-14

REPORT OF THE HEAD OF STREETSCENE

1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

1.1 The purpose of the report is to update members on the following: The input to and allocation of the 2013-14 Highway Maintenance Budgets.

2. BACKGROUND

2.1 At February's Place Board members were asked for their input into both the highway maintenance revenue budget spend categories and to select schemes up to a value of £60,000 to include in the 2013-2014 Highway Maintenance Programme.

3.0 RESPONSES

- 3.1 Generally the comments received from all five Place Boards in regard to the revenue budgets were that they should remain as outlined in the report and that the additional spend on road marking maintenance was welcomed.
- 3.2 In regard to the 2013-2014 Highway Maintenance Capital Scheme Programme, members of Washington South ward nominated those schemes which they believed to be a priority for the area from the original select list. These schemes are highlighted in Table A and are marked with an asterisk. In addition following consultation with their ward colleagues, Place Board members identified a number of other streets for officers to examine, consider and to cost up. These streets are highlighted in Table B. Officers' comments are included for the Board's consideration.

4.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

4.1 Place Board members are recommended to consider the report, and nominate schemes, up to a value of £60,000, for inclusion in next year's Highway Maintenance Capital Programme and agree to seek Area Committee's approval for the selected highway schemes.
