TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT PROPOSALS WHICH ARE CONSIDERED TO HAVE MERIT

A recent review of speed limits within the City of Sunderland has revealed that speed limit Orders cannot be confirmed for two roads within the city. The first is a section of the A184 Newcastle Road, between Herbert Terrace and the city boundary with South Tyneside, a distance of 778 metres. The second, is a section of the B1522 Stockton Road, south of Ryhope Village, between Viewforth Road and the city boundary, a distance of 866 metres.

Newcastle Road is a single carriageway road, which is signed as a de-restricted road, with a national speed limit of 60 MPH.

Stockton Road from its junction with Viewforth Road is a single carriageway road, which becomes a dual carriageway south of its junction with the A1018. The road is signed as derestricted, with the national speed limit applicable to both sections.

It is considered a possibility that speed limit Orders were made in the days when Sunderland was part of County Durham or the County of Tyne and Wear, however any speed limit Orders that were made during these times cannot be located or verified.

As both roads have street lighting erected along them, this would mean they should be subject to a 30 MPH speed limit, unless a de-restriction Order has been made.

The Council considers that the speed limit currently indicated on both roads is suitable for the roads and their environs and therefore intends regularise the speed limits by introducing a de-restriction Order to maintain continuity, the roads will therefore remain de-restricted once the Orders are introduced.

The lengths of road to which the de-restriction Orders will apply is shown on drawings No. 09/TM/1450/01 and 09/TM/1458/01 attached.


