Laura Murrell, a resident of Sunderland, has submitted the following question to be put to the Council meeting on 24 March 2021.

"The vaccination programme in Sunderland is proceeding very well. However, vaccination alone is not a silver bullet and must be undertaken at the same time as keeping the levels of infection as low as possible.

Children in all age groups returned to school on March 8th 2021 and there have been reports that several schools in Sunderland have had pupils who tested positive for coronavirus.

The Lateral Flow Device (rapid) testing being undertaken in schools and latterly by pupils at home is not very accurate at detecting positive cases of Covid in asymptomatic people, only having about a 50% success rate.

I would, therefore, like to ask: do those pupils testing positive then go on to have a second PCR test to make the results less likely to be false positive and, therefore, more likely to be correct and what measures are being taken to support their families and ensure that they do self-isolate, in order to overcome the disincentive to test at home if a family cannot comply with this requirement"

Pam Wortley, a resident of Sunderland, has submitted the following question to be put to the Council meeting on 24 March 2021.

"At its last meeting on 27th January, Sunderland Council approved a motion, on the COVID-19 Vaccination Program, which included the following statement "....the immunisation campaign should be embedded into the local primary care and public health teams, and must work in tandem with an effective test and trace system. The Council calls on the Government to fix the malfunctioning "test and trace" system or give local authorities the power and funding to coordinate test and trace themselves".

There is a "Local O Scheme" being trialled in Lambeth which means that positive cases are handed straight to local contact tracing teams, with no delay at all. Is it possible for Sunderland Council to undertake a similar scheme and provide an effective test and trace system for Sunderland residents"
