1. Why has it come to committee?

1.1 At its June meeting, the committee agreed its work plan for the 2009/10 municipal year and the Attractive & Inclusive priority is the second to come to committee for discussion and consideration.

 - 2 Improve local shopping centres
 - 3 Make landlords accountable for state of their property
 - 4 Reduce problems caused by unadopted roads
 - 5 Bring empty properties back into use
 - 6 Address lack of parking provision in residential areas
 - 7 Make estates and residential areas more attractive
 - 8 Address issues around lack of public transport in some areas
