

This would actively promote Corporate Parenting responsibilities of Elected Members across the Council. The review also recommended that all other Elected Members should be invited as participant observers to the Corporate Parenting Board, as all Members had corporate parenting responsibilities.

In accordance with section 17 of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989, the approval of alternative arrangements to the political balance requirement was proposed in respect of the Scrutiny Committee.

- Item 10. To appoint to Joint Committees, Joint Authorities, outside bodies and Working Groups and to note the Leader's Appointments to Joint Committees established under joint arrangements.
- Item 11. To agree amendments (if any) to the scheme of delegation in respect of Council functions.
- Item 12. To fix dates and times of meetings of the Council, the Cabinet and Committees.
- Item 13. To authorise the Head of Law and Governance, in consultation with the respective Chairmen, to make such changes as may be deemed necessary or expedient in connection with 12 above.

Councillor Ellis, seconded by Councillor D. Smith, moved an amendment in respect of the Scrutiny Committee to include all Groups in the ratio of 5:2:1.

Upon being put to the vote, the Amendment was defeated with 58 Members voting against and 4 Members voting in favour.

Councillor D. Smith, seconded by Councillor Ellis, moved a further amendment in respect of the Scrutiny Committee to include all Groups in the ratio of 6:1:1.

Upon being put to the vote, the Amendment was defeated with 59 Members voting against, 2 Members voting in favour and 1 Member abstaining.

As alternative arrangements could only be agreed if no member objected and Councillor Ellis had indicated her objection, in order to comply with political balance requirements, the Leader advised Council of the nomination of Cllr Waller to the position of Scrutiny Lead Member for Children's Services on the Scrutiny Committee, and it was:-

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REPORT OF THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE

SCRUTINY MATTERS: ANNUAL SCRUTINY REPORT 2012/13

1. Purpose of the Report

1.1 To present the Annual Scrutiny Report which summaries the work of the Scrutiny Committee during 2012/13.

2. Background Information

2.1 The Annual Report provides an overview of the positive outcomes achieved to help drive improvements to public services in Sunderland as a direct result of the key areas of work undertaken by the Scrutiny Committee and its supporting panels during the last 12 months. It also outlines the implementation of a new way of working with the Scrutiny Committee and six supporting panels.

3. Operation of the Scrutiny Committee

3.1 In June 2012, the Scrutiny Committee agreed its annual work programme for the municipal year 2012/13. The year has been a very busy year for the Scrutiny Committee and its supporting panels. Each of the panels has undertaken two projects as well as working on individual commissioned items which collectively form a comprehensive review of issues and policies over the year.

4. Conclusion

4.1 The Scrutiny Committee has delivered a demanding, varied and interesting work programme in 2012/13 with 2013/14 promising to be another challenging and fulfilling year.

AREA COMMITTEES ANNUAL REPORT 2012/13

1. Purpose of the Report

This requirement is now contained in Regulation 11 of the Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information) (England) Regulations 2012.

This is the special urgency provision under which key decisions may be taken by the executive, although not contained in the 28 day Notice of Key Decisions (whether proposed to be taken in public or in private), where compliance with Regulation 10 (the general exception) was also impracticable.

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APPOINTMENTS TO OUTSIDE BODIES – NEWCASTLE AIRPORT LOCAL AUTHORITY HOLDING COMPANY LIMITED and the NORTH EAST LOCAL TRANSPORT BODY

Report of the Executive Director of Commercial and Corporate Services

1.0 Introduction

1.1 The purpose of this report is to consider appointments to Newcastle Airport Local Authority Holding Company Limited and the North East Local Transport Body.

2.0 Newcastle Airport Local Authority Holding Company Limited

2.1 Under the updated and streamlined governance arrangements for Newcastle International Airport each LA7 Local Authority shall appoint their respective Leader of the Council or Elected Mayor (as applicable) to be its nominated Director to the Local Authority Holding Company. In addition, each Director shall be entitled to appoint an alternate. Previously, each LA7 Local Authority appointed two Directors, and could remove any such Director from office and appoint another person or persons in their place.

The Council is accordingly asked to confirm the appointment of the Leader of the Council to Newcastle Airport Local Authority Holding Company Limited and note the appointment of the Deputy Leader as his alternate.

3.0 The North East Local Transport Body

3.1 The Department of Transport intends to devolve funding for Local Major Transport Schemes to Local Transport Bodies from 2015. The Local Transport Body relevant to Sunderland will have a boundary covering the administrative area of the North East Local Enterprise Partnership, comprising the metropolitan area of Tyne and Wear together with Durham and Northumberland counties. The Local Transport Body will be known as the North East Local Transport Body ("NELTB") and will be an informal partnership. The full members of NELTB are Durham County Council, Gateshead Metropolitan Borough Council, Newcastle City Council, North Tyneside Council, Northumberland County Council, South Tyneside Council, Sunderland City Council and the Tyne and Wear Integrated Transport Authority.

Subject to the Department for Transport (DfT) approving the new Body's Assurance Framework, it is proposed that the first meeting of the Body will be in July 2013.

The Cabinet at its meeting on 13th February, 2013, gave approval for Sunderland City Council to be a member of the North East Local Transport Body. The Councils will be represented by their respective Leaders or Elected Mayors and each member is asked to nominate a deputy.

The Council is accordingly asked to confirm the appointment of the Leader of the Council to the North East Local Transport Body and nominate a deputy.

4.0 Recommendations

- 4.1 The Council is accordingly recommended to:
 - (i) confirm the appointment of the Leader of the Council to Newcastle Airport Local Authority Holding Company Limited and note the appointment of the Deputy Leader as his alternate; and
 - (ii) confirm the appointment of the Leader of the Council to the North East Local Transport Body and nominate a deputy.

APPROVAL OF REASON FOR FAILURE TO ATTEND MEETINGS – COUNCILLOR F ANDERSON

Report of the Executive Director of Commercial and Corporate Services

1.0 Introduction

1.1 The purpose of this report is to seek the approval of the Council, under Section 85 (1) of the Local Government Act 1972, to the reason for Councillor Anderson's current inability to attend meetings due to illness.

2.0 Background

- 2.1 Section 85(1) of the Act provides that "if a Member of a local authority fails throughout a period of six consecutive months from the date of his last attendance to attend any meeting of the authority, he shall, unless the failure was due to some reason approved by the authority before the expiry of that period, cease to be a member of the authority."
- 2.2 Due to illness, Councillor Anderson has been unable to attend any meeting of the authority since her last attendance at the Council Meeting on 30th January 2013. Although she attended a meeting of the Coalfield Area People Board on 18th February, 2013, for the purpose of the relevant legislation, her last attendance is taken to be 30th January.

3.0 Recommendation

3.1 The Council is accordingly asked to consider approving Councillor Anderson's reason for failure to attend meetings in accordance with Section 85(1) of the Local Government Act 1972.

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
