East Sunderland a Learning Area Summary

1. Why has it come to committee?

1.1 At its last meeting in June, the committee agreed its work plan for the 2009/10 municipal year and the Learning priority is the second to come to committee for discussion and consideration.

- **2.1** Following the extensive programme of consultation with members, partners, community stakeholders and the wider community, the agreed priorities for this theme are:
 - Encourage young people to continue into further education.
 - Support more adults to return to learning.
 - Increase opportunities to deliver informal education courses.
 - Better support for young people e.g. more youth and play services.
 - Do more to ensure health and emotional well being of children and young people.
 - Reduce barriers in accessing services and provision which offer support to parents and carers.

 - Allocation of SIB/SIP
 - £30,000, one off capital, plus £38,000 per year for three years for revenue, total: £144,000. Supplement current practice with mobile provision. Applications are being made to all Area Committees. (Youth Development Group)
 - \circ Review
 - Resources are needed or services should be realigned to provide 1:2:1 Support Workers, using good practice, as established at Blue Watch. Extending the remit to be more inclusive and addressing a wider range of issues would provide emphasis on 1:2:1 support on a referral basis linking with Common Assessment Framework teams. (Children Services)
 - Investigate and feedback to Area Committee on the feasibility of amending the procurement process to make the process more accessible. (Office of the Chief Executive)
 - Source additional funding to deliver low level accredited learning (level 1 or level 2) ensuring seamless progression routes for local residents. (F.A.C.L.)
 - Resources needed to deliver Healthy Living Club and Young Mums Drop in programme. (T.P.C.T. and CCS)
 - Sunderland Young Peoples Bike Project (SYPBP) when funding is available will be able to provide a Cycling Club (Pilot) one session per week. Encourage parents and young people to spend time together sharing interests, working together, breaking down generational gaps etc. (SYPBP, CCS and TPCT)
 - Escalate to Scrutiny or LSP
 - Investigate the possibility of increasing the number of apprenticeship opportunities offered, including by the public sector. (ALE)
