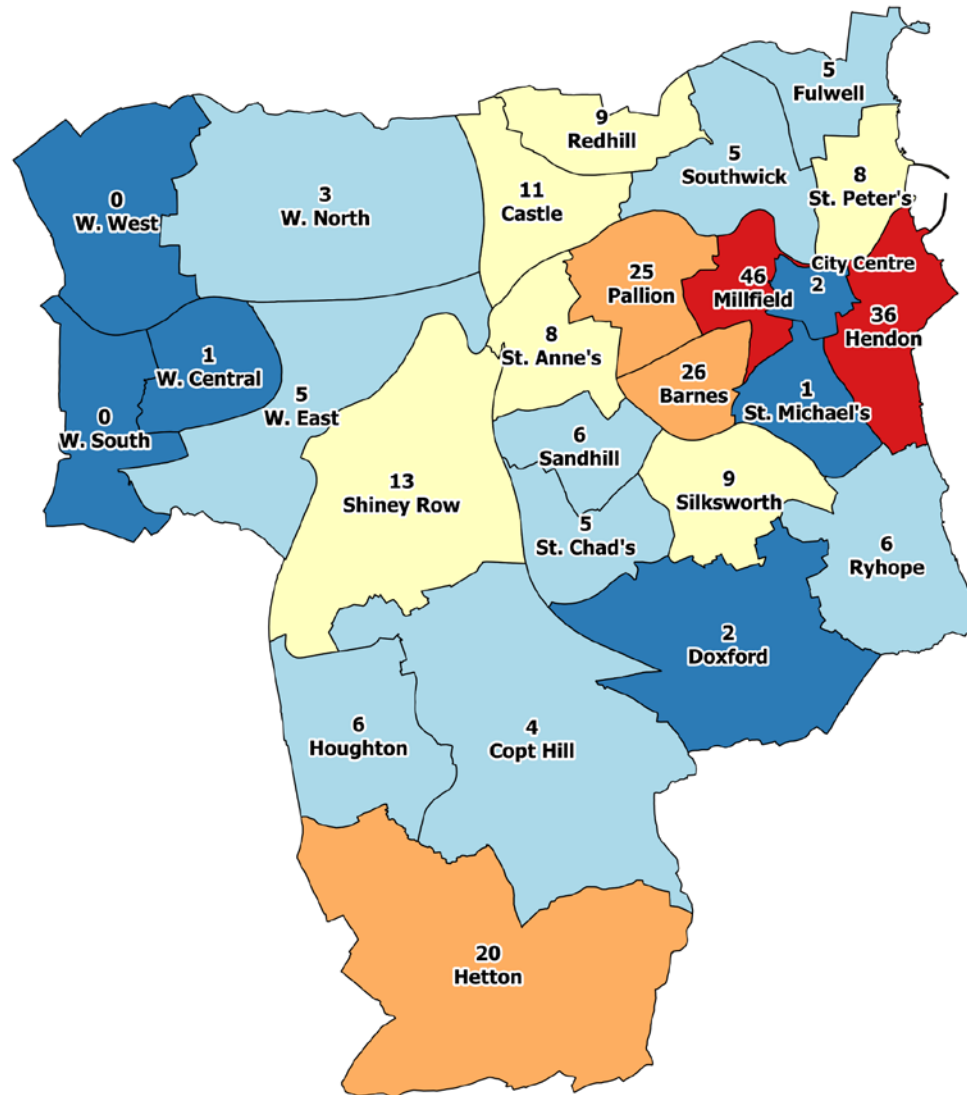
Dumping of Waste - Ap 18 to Dec 18
