# STRATEGIC INITIATIVES BUDGET (SIB): REGENERATION ISSUES REPORT

#### **Report of the Chief Executive**

## 1.0 Purpose Of The Report

1.1 This report outlines current expenditure from the Strategic Initiatives Budget (SIB) and applications for funding from this budget in order to support new initiatives, which will benefit the area.

## 2.0 Description of Decision (Recommendation)

- 2.1 The Committee is requested to approve the following:
  - Funding to support proposals for new projects. Full applications are included in Annex 1

## 3.0 Background

3.1 Each Regeneration Framework area has been allocated a minimum budget of £200,000 per annum over the last thirteen years. Over this period, therefore, the Framework area has been allocated £2,748,568 in this way.

#### 4.0 Current Position

- 4.1 Following the 5<sup>th</sup> June 2008 Committee meeting, a balance of £72,132 remained to be allocated from 2008/09.
- 4.2 Following the establishment of SIP for city wide CCTV, the Area Committee will re-claim two previously supported SIB applications for Coalfield CCTV, totalling £74,000, leaving a total balance of £146,132 to be allocated from 2008/09.
- 4..3 There are five applications for funding presented to this Committee requesting a total of either £49,654 or £40,577 from the 2008/09 budget and a further £5,000 from the 2009/10. Should the Committee grant this request, £214,664 or £205,587 will be committed from this years budget, leaving a balance of £96,478 or £105,555 for allocation. (two sets of figures are shown to indicate totals depending on which option is agreed for application 3 Hetton Centre), and £5,000 will be committed from 2009/10 budget.

#### 5.0 Reasons for the Decision

5.1 SIB was established to promote action on key priorities identified in the relevant Area Regeneration Frameworks, and to attract other funding into the area. Applications for SIB funding should demonstrate the potential benefits to local communities the proposed project would bring, and subsequently be able to provide evidence and statistics that can illustrate these benefits.
