- 3. IRO'S: Gavin and Kim have attended some of our change council meetings to ask if the group knew what an IRO is and did we know who ours was? The majority of the group didn't, some of the older ones did but we realized that more people would know who their IRO is if there was a leaflet, however the group decided against it. We did come up with the idea of having a board with individual little photos of the IRO's with their name underneath and it would be displayed in the next step building and in the children's homes on top of that they would send you a letter from your IRO including the information about who they are and what they are going to help/make a difference to the young person and the letter would also include there contact details. With this letter and visits from your IRO every young person should know who their IRO is and what they are for.
- 4. Complaints and compliments leaflet: we reviewed the complaints and compliments leaflet and decided they are not very young people friendly and most of the group had not even seen them so we are in the process or re designing them. You can also make a complaint through MOMO but we are still in the process of re vamping it to make it easier to understand and more young people friendly.
- **5. Two Groups:** We have decided to split the group to be more focused, from February we will have a 15 and under group focusing on LAC issues and a 16+ group which will focus on leaving care issues. Some of the work plan will involve both groups.
