Policy Review -**Refuse Collection and Waste Management - Update** Cllr Bonallie recapped on the recent visit on 8th October 2012 to Beech Street Depot with some of the members from the panel and advised members that a further visit to the Energy Waste Plant in Teesside was currently being planned. Cllr Bonallie drew member's attention to the Refuse Collection and Waste Management Update Report and asked Les Clarke for an update on the position of the Council's current bid to the weekly Collection Support Scheme. LC – advised the panel that the Council are still awaiting the LC/JD results of the current bid to the weekly Collection Support Scheme and it is hoped that a decision should be reached by the end of November. Tell Us Once for Bereavement Service - Consideration of Recommendations of final report JD – advised members that the evidence gathering over the last few months which has included panel members meeting with various council officers and visiting the Moorside Contact Centre along with the Corner's Court has been collated together and set out in the report along with the conclusions and recommendations.
