REPORT OF HEAD OF MEMBER SERVICES AND COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

1. Purpose of the Report

1.1 The purpose of the report is to consider and agree a work programme for the Committee for the municipal year 2018/19.

2. Background

- 2.1 The work programme is designed to set out the key issues to be addressed by the Committee during the year and provide it with a timetable of work. The Committee itself is responsible for setting its own work programme, subject to the coordinating role of the Scrutiny Coordinating Committee.
- 2.2 To be most effective, the work programme should provide a basis and framework for the work of the Committee, while retaining sufficient flexibility to respond to any important issues that emerge during the course of the year. The work programme is therefore intended to be a working document that the Committee can develop and refer to throughout the year.
- 2.3 In order to ensure that the Committee is able to undertake all of its business and respond to emerging issues, there will be scope for additional meetings or visits not detailed in the work programme.
- 2.4 The remit of the Economic Prosperity Scrutiny Committee covers the following:-

Any matter relating to the economic prosperity of the city and the performance of services to support that including physical infrastructure, sector growth and skills, economic vibrancy, Safer Sunderland, licensing and trading standards, strategic transport, environmental services, libraries, heritage and tourism.

- 2.5 The work programme should reflect the remit of the Committee and the need to balance its responsibility for undertaking scrutiny, performance management and policy review.
- 2.6 The work programme should also reflect and be aligned to the key priorities of the Council as set out in documents such as the Sunderland Strategy and Corporate Plan, reflect issues highlighted following external assessments and issues raised during the Committee development sessions.

3 DETERMINING THE SCRUTINY WORK PROGRAMME

- 3. On 31 May 2018, the Committee held a workshop session to discuss potential items for inclusion in the work programme.
- 3.1 As requested by Members the table below provides details of the issues considered for inclusion in the work programme:-

| Events | To review the contribution and outcomes of the major events held in the city during the year including the Air show, Illuminations and Tall ships |
| Infrastructure Delivery Plan | To monitor progress on the implementation of the Infrastructure Delivery Plan for developments contained in the Core |

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| Business Centres – Progress Report | To consider the progress made by the Council's Business Centres (Evolve, the Software Centre and Washington Business Centre) including their financial position and occupancy figures |
| International Strategy | To review the work of the International Strategy Steering Group over the year and its contribution to economic growth and prosperity |
| Public Space Protection Orders (PSPO) | To consider the impact of the introduction of PSPO's in the city centre and plans for the future |
| Environmental Enforcement | To review of the progress of the Environmental Enforcement Team Following the implementation of the Council's new Environmental Policy |
| Waste Management Strategy | To consider the operation of the Waste Management Strategy, meet with partners and visit sites at Teesside/Springwell/Hendon to view how the waste stream is treated |
| Apprenticeships | To consider the recent legislative changes and meet with partners in the private and public sectors to discuss the development of apprenticeships in the city |
