



- 30 January 2020 Level 4 National Incident
- 15 April 2020 Elective Programme Suspended for at least 3 months
 (Excluding Cancer and Urgent Cases)
- What did this mean for STSFT in lost activity:
 - o Outpatients circa 205,000 new, follow-up and outpatient procedures
 - o Inpatient and Day cases circa 21,000
 - To catch up in 1 year we would need to deliver 125% of baseline activity



Key Operational Deliverables


- Abolish104 week waits
- Reduce 52 week waits
- Reduce outpatient follow up by 25%
- Patient initiated follow up (PIFU) 5% March 23 (0.7 0.9%)
- Advice and guidance 12 per 100 (8 per 100)
- Diagnostics 120%
- Targeted lung health checks (CT scanners)
- 12 hr waits < 2%
- Increase Urgent Treatment Centre
- 5000 beds (virtual)





Year to date – 76.18% National Position – 59.9%
