Over the last three months there have been 110 inductions and over 80 regular members attending the facilities. The tennis nets have been installed and the courts are available to the public every evening and a Saturday morning and the sports pavilion is up and running offering classes such as karate, yoga, dance, football training, tennis and keep fit. This quarter the Dream Scheme programme has worked closely with 35 young people which in turn has made a positive contribution to their local community, as they have taken an active role throughout the estates and have recently taken part in the developing a Charter for the Plains Farm Estate. In the Silksworth area the young people have participated in a tidy up around Silksworth Community Association to clean up their local area. As a result of the project young people from both Silksworth and Plains Farm were nominated and won the section for service to the community in the Young Achievers Awards 2008 and were presented with the award at the Stadium of Light in March and also received Citywide recognition for their hard work. The Dream Scheme's ongoing work includes working with young people from a Farringdon Estates to establish a good working relationship with them
