GAMBLING ACT 2005 – CONSIDERATION OF THE GRANT OF A BETTING PREMISES LICENCE

LADBROKES, 49 – 51 SEA ROAD, SUNDERLAND, SR6 9BW

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the grant of a betting premises licence for the above-mentioned premises.

2.0 DESCRIPTION OF DECISION

- 2.1 When determining the application the Sub-Committee is requested to have regard to the representations referred to in paragraph 4.0 below and to take such steps as they consider appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps may be:
 - a) to grant the application,
 - b) to modify the conditions of the licence, or
 - c) to reject the whole or part of the application.

3.0 INTRODUCTION/BACKGROUND

- 3.1 Relevant representations have been received in relation to the application and these are detailed at section 4.0.
- 3.2 A copy of the application form is attached as Appendix 1.
- 3.3 When considering an application made under the Act, section 153(1) requires the Council to aim to permit the use of the premises for gambling as long as the Council thinks that it is;
 - a) in accordance with any relevant code of practice issued by the Gambling Commission;
 - b) in accordance with any relevant guidance issued by the Gambling Commission;
 - c) reasonably consistent with the Licensing Objectives (subject to a) and b) above), and

- d) in accordance with the Council's own Statement of Licensing Policy (subject to a), b) and c) above).
- 3.4 For the information of the Committee, the Licensing Objectives are;
 - a) preventing gambling from being a source of crime or disorder, being associated with crime or disorder or being used to support crime.
 - b) ensuring that gambling is conducted in a fair and open way, and
 - c) protecting children and other vulnerable persons from being harmed or exploited by gambling.
- 3.5 However, the Council is not constrained to consider only these issues and, in fact, has a wider discretion as to how it determines applications under the Act.
- 3.6 The only matters that the Council may not take into consideration when determining an application are;
 - a) the expected demand for the gambling facilities sought and;
 - b) whether or not the proposed facilities are likely to be permitted in accordance with legislation relating to planning or building.

4.0 CURRENT POSITION

- 4.1 Representations have been received from an interested party in relation to this application. A copy of their representation is attached as Appendix 2.
- 4.2 For the information of the Committee, the applicant has not requested that the statutory default condition which limits the operating times of the premises to 07:00 to 22:00 be either amended or removed from the premises licence if granted. Therefore, unless the Committee decide otherwise, those times will frame the maximum operating hours for the premises.
- 4.3 For the information of the Committee and with regard to the matters outlined at 3.3 above, the Licensing Section is unaware of any information which may suggest that the gambling facilities requested would not be;
 - a) in accordance with any relevant code of practice issued by the Gambling Commission;
 - b) in accordance with any relevant guidance issued by the Gambling Commission;
 - c) reasonably consistent with the Licensing Objectives (subject to a) and b) above), and
 - d) in accordance with the Council's own Statement of Licensing Policy (subject to a), b) and c) above).

4.4 However, as mentioned at 3.5 above, the Committee is entitled to consider other issues raised by the interested party.

5.0 REASONS FOR THE DECISION

5.1 In making their decision, the Committee is advised to consider the Gambling Act 2005, the Gambling Commission's Guidance on the Act and the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, copies of which have been made available to the Committee.

6.0 ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS

6.1 None submitted.

Objections to Application reference: 13/01238/GAPREM 49-51 Sea Road.

Further to our conversation, I have set out for your convenience my objections to the above application.

My objections rest on the fact that Sea Road already has two such licensed premises: Wm. Hill at 34-36; Coral at 16-18 respectively.

I object to the proposed application fro the following reasons:

1. Public safety.

The site, which is on the corner of Sea Road and Fulwell Road, is a very busy intersection.

Many users of the other gambling premises in Sea Road tend to park in the surrounding streets (all of which are often full with shoppers' cars) or Sea Road itself and visit from there.

The lack of provided car parking at the proposed premises would impact on the already difficult parking around Fulwell and have implications for public safety at this busy crossroads.

2. Protection of children and vulnerable persons.

In the interests of protecting children and other vulnerable persons from being harmed or exploited by gambling, I object to the proposed license on the basis that Sea Road and that intersection in particular, are often thronged with schoolchildren on their way to and from either: Fulwell Infant School, Fulwell Junior School, Seaburn Dene Primary School, Monkwearmouth School.

At break times and at lunchtime particularly, the footfall of schoolchildren is very heavy as Sea Road is a popular lunch break destination. Many of the local food businesses which thrive on this aspect of trade are situated at the Fulwell Road end

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of Sea Road, which is near to the site for which the application has been lodged and the schoolchildren visiting these establishments will invariably have to pass the proposed site. Unless the premises has blank windows as does not advertise in any way whatsoever, I cannot see how this will have anything other than a damaging effect on our children.
