REGENERATION ISSUES REPORT: FEEDBACK ON PROJECTS PREVIOUSLY FUNDED THROUGH STRATEGIC INITIATIVES BUDGET (SIB)

Report of the Acting Chief Executive

1.0 Purpose Of The Report

1.1 This report provides information to the Area Committee on expenditure from the Strategic Initiatives Budget (SIB) on projects it has previously funded

2.0 Background

- 2.1 Each Regeneration Framework area has been allocated a minimum of £200,000 per annum over the last thirteen years, from the Strategic Initiatives Budget, to promote action on key priorities identified in the relevant Area Regeneration Frameworks, and to attract other funding into the area. Over this period, therefore, the Framework area has been allocated £2,587,383 in this way.
- 2.2 In order that the Area Committee can be kept informed of progress on projects it has previously funded as part of the SIB monitoring process, a programme of report backs has been scheduled.

3.0 Purpose of the Feedback Reports

- 3.1 The aim of the reports is to inform the Area Committee how the money it has been allocated through SIB has been used, how successful it has been in achieving its original objectives, and how the project will continue. Specifically, the reports have been asked to address the following key questions:
 - How has the money has been used? How much was capital and revenue?
 - What were the outcomes of the project? How has it helped to achieve the objectives identified in the original submission? Are there any statistics that will support the outcomes?
 - What other funding the SIB allocation helped to attract?
 - What are the key lessons learnt? What difference has the project made in comparison to other areas that did not have such funding? What added value did the project provide? Are there implications for existing service provision?
 - Does the project need to continue? Has it come to its natural end? If not, how will it be funded? Has it been considered for mainstream funding? Have other funding sources been approached?
- 3.2 Once the presentation has been completed, Elected Members will be invited to ask any questions or offer comments concerning the project.

3.4 Please Describe the project:

We need to raise a substantial amount of money to purchase a Carbon Fibre Competition Tumble Track. Primarily the purchase of a tumble track will enable the club to host annual team tumbling competitions, providing more local opportunities for club members of all abilities. The team tumbling events will provide the club with increased revenue opportunities and increase parental participation strengthening the local community and of course the team spirit of the club.

Local gymnasts will be able to improve tumbling skills every week and be better equipped for other national competitions, which they compete in. The track will enable our club members to compete on a level playing field and no longer be disadvantaged, as they do not currently have the experience of tumbling on a competition surface.

At the moment we train on an inflatable track and on hard floor, this year we have had 5 tumblers who have won a place to National Finals. One of our boy tumblers won the Bronze medal, if we had a competition track our gymnasts would have the same advantage as the other competitors and therefore perform better.

3.5 What service does the organisation currently provide and how will this be complemented by the project?

Biddick Sports Community Gymnastics Club provides gymnastics training for children from babies to young adults. We have 6 sections currently running within the club,

- 1. Fun-4-babies which is for parents and babies working on social, emotional and educational skills
- 2. Pre-School section, is for two to five year olds again with parents working on social, emotional and educational skills
- 3. General Gymnastics sessions is rising fives to ten years working basic gymnastic skills
- 4. Women's Artistic is for the more advanced gymnasts who want to work on bars, beam, floor and vault skills to a higher level
- 5. Sports Acro Section is for the advanced gymnast who does not want to work on equipment
- 6. Tumbling section is our newest section and becoming more popular

Almost every section would benefit with the tumble track as the gymnasts can have more repetition on any flight elements as the track will not be as severe on the wrist and ankle joints. We can also get other clubs involved in extra training camps during the holidays and weekends

Please explain your answer:

Having a carbon fibre tumble track will improve the standard of the gymnasts' work and training. Currently for our tumbler to train on a competition track we have to take them to a centre North of the river Tyne. There is only one session available on a Sunday afternoon making it impractical (and expensive) for many. All sections of the club will raise their standards of tumbling, as having a track will enable more repetitive work and less strain on the wrists and ankles. It will also benefit the other local smaller clubs as we have a policy of sharing our equipment. Within the club we have gymnasts who have won medals in the national team tumbling and individual awards. These young gymnasts will show rapid improvements and increase their national ratings. Hosting a national team tumbling competition will also raise the profile of Biddick and Washington in the gymnastics circle.

As Biddick has successfully passed Gym Mark status for three years we have all policies in place. Our aim at Biddick gym club is that every child gets a right to train or compete regardless of their capability. Having the track will enable the beginner tumbler to take part in a tumbling competition, or the gymnasts from a low-income family compete in a National Competition without the travelling and hotel expenses that can be quite expensive. Also running a national competition will give parents and relatives the opportunity to watch or get involved with the organisation of the competitions. It will also give the gym the opportunity to raise money to help with the funding of other comps.
