1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 The purpose of this paper is to present the draft Statement of Assurance and Annual Report (SOAAR) 2018/19 (to be tabled on the day) to members for approval.

2 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 The Fire and Rescue National Framework requires that Fire and Rescue Authorities must provide a SOAAR to its communities, Government, local authorities, partners and stakeholders. This report must provide an accessible account of the Authority's performance, effectiveness and value for money.
- 2.2 The SOAAR is also a source of information used by the Secretary of State for their biennial report under section 25 of the Fire and Rescue Services Act 2004.

3. STATEMENT OF ASSURANCE AND ANNUAL REPORT

- 3.1 The Tyne and Wear Fire and Rescue Service (TWFRS) SOAAR includes the following content:
 - The statement of accounts
 - An annual governance statement
 - How the Authority meets the requirements of the National Framework
 - Details of consultation on strategic plans including the IRMP
 - Assurance regarding operational competence
 - Consideration to the principles of transparency (set out in the Code of Recommended Practice for Local Authorities on Data Transparency).
- 3.2 TWFRS has also made reference to documents within its SOAAR where the required information is already available in a clear, accessible and user friendly format.

4 HOW TWFRA PERFORMED

- 4.1 Although the Authority still faces financial pressures, its workforce is committed to working with partners and supporting investment to deliver positive outcomes for all of its Tyne and Wear communities.
- 4.2 The SOAAR highlights that during 2018/19:
 - The Control room has received over 29,700 calls
 - Our Prevention and Education team has delivered over 24,600 Home Safety Checks
 - Our Fire Safety team has carried out 1,700 fire safety audits on commercial premises
 - Based on the latest Home Office figures, we have the second fastest response rate of any metropolitan fire services to dwelling fires.

5.1 There are no risks associated with publishing the SOAAR. We have worked closely with internal and external audit throughout the year on our financial and governance positions.
