Energy Company Obligation 4 Flexible Energy (ECO 4 Flex) Scheme: Statement of Intent – Report of the Executive Director of City Development

Full description of decision:

To:

- i) approve the draft Statement of Intent (SOI) for delivery of ECO 4 Flex in Sunderland, and its publication;
- ii) authorise the Executive Director of City Development, in consultation with the Leader and Deputy Leader, to appoint approved energy suppliers to take forward delivery of the scheme; and
- iii) authorise the Executive Director of City Development, in consultation with the Leader and Deputy Leader, to make changes to the SOI such as those that may be required by the Office of Gas and Electricity Markets (Ofgem), including as a result of changes to government policy or guidance.

Reasons for decision:

Publication of an agreed local ECO 4 Flex SOI is required to enable a significant number of Sunderland residents to benefit from energy saving measures, which will be funded in most cases by the main energy suppliers. These measures will lower carbon emissions and reduce household fuel bills. It is expected to have a positive impact on residents living in deprived areas, on low incomes, facing high and potentially unaffordable fuel costs, or with a heightened vulnerability to cold.

A procurement exercise will be undertaken to appoint approved energy suppliers to take forward delivery within the city through direct contracts between the energy suppliers and their appointed contractors and individual households. It is intended that through the procurement exercise energy suppliers will be asked to draw on local or regional contractors for delivery within the city wherever possible.

Changes to the SOI are expected to be required when changes to national ECO Guidance and secondary legislation are made. The SOI and any future amendments to the SOI must be lodged with Ofgem. Delegating such changes will enable the scheme to continue to be delivered within the city uninterrupted and is consistent with the requirement for approval of the SOI at Director level as a minimum to meet BEIS and Ofgem requirements.

Alternative options considered and rejected:

The alternative option would be not to approve a local ECO 4 Flex Scheme and associated SOI. However, this would prevent local households being able to receive this financial assistance towards energy efficiency measures. It would also make it more difficult for the Council to enable delivery against the ambition to be a carbon neutral city by 2040, in accordance with the Sunderland Low Carbon Framework.
