Sunderland is.....


- A Split Land
- The region's biggest city, but with a weak economic pull
- Renowned for an adaptable Workforce, but few are highly paid
- Stable in overall population but losing 15 35 year olds
- Low cost but low value location for Businesses
- Better at attracting international companies than local growth
- A city with a university but not a university city
- Well placed to develop new, innovative industry sectors of regional significance, but hasn't done it yet.
- Asset rich but not making the most of what its got






Northern Gateway. Entrepot - Trading City

The preferred direction

'What could the city become by building on existing strengths?'

An entrepreneurial university city at the heart of a low carbon regional economy

- Based on Entrepreneurial/ Nimble city
- Focus on low carbon
- Still about inward investment
- Make better use of the river, coast and countryside



KEY Propositions

- 1. Make the city centre the focus of a more prosperous Sunderland
- 2. A stronger role for the University of Sunderland in the city's economic programme.
- 3. Prioritising critical transport gateways and corridors into Sunderland.
- 4. A major push to attract companies, money and people to help Sunderland develop the following industries: advanced automotives, software, offshore energy and health care and well being. There will be a dedicated sector plan for each.
- 5. Attracting and retaining young people (under 35's) in the city.
- 6. Using housing to attract and keep everyone in the city.
- 7. Be an outward looking city that plays a strong role in the City Region.
