# **REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF NEIGHBOURHHOODS**

# LOCAL GOVERNMENT (MISCELLEANEOUS PROVISIONS) ACT 1976 - PROPOSED VARIATION OF HACKNEY CARRIAGE FARE STRUCTURE

# 1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

**1.1** The purpose of this report is to seek the consideration of the Committee of a request received from the Sunderland Hackney Carriage Operators' Association (SHCOA) for increases to the present scale of hackney carriage fares.

# 2.0 DESCRIPTION OF DECISION (RECOMMENDATIONS)

- **2.1** The Committee is requested to consider whether or not to agree the following requests, subject to statutory advertising:
  - i) An increase in the Tariff One charges as set out in paragraph 4.2;
  - ii) An increase in the Tariff Two charges as set out in paragraph 4.3; and
  - iii) An increase in the Tariff Three charges as set out in paragraph 4.4.

## 3.0 INTRODUCTION/BACKGROUND

- **3.1** The Committee is, occasionally, asked by the hackney carriage trade to consider an increase in the scale of fares that the Council allows hackney carriage drivers to charge. The last increase agreed by the Regulatory Committee came into force in April 2018.
- **3.2** Should the Committee be minded to alter the current fare structure, they are advised that, under the provisions of Section 65 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976, any such proposal must be published in a local newspaper and a period of not less than 14 days allowed for objections to be made. Any objections received must be given full consideration before the revised fares can come into operation. If no objections are received, the revised fares come into effect upon expiry of the objection period.

## 4.0 CURRENT POSITION.

- **4.1** Listed at paragraphs 4.2 to 4.4 below are the tariffs currently charged and those requested by SHCOA.
- **4.2** TARIFF ONE This charge applies to journeys undertaken Monday Saturday 7.00 am to 11.00 pm with the exception of Public and Bank Holidays and the Christmas / New Year period.

The current Tariff One is:-

If the distance does not exceed 137.16m (150 yds), for the whole distance £2.60.

If the distance exceeds 137.16m (150 yds), for the first 137.16m (150 yds) £2.60	(150 yds), for the first 137.16m (150 yds) £2.	e distance exceeds 137.16m (150 yds), for the first 137.16
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and each subsequent 205.74m (225 yds) or uncompleted part thereof £0.20.

The Tariff One requested by SHCOA is:-

If the distance does not exceed 137.16m (150 yds), for the whole distance £2.60. If the distance exceeds 137.16m (150 yds), for the first 137.16m (150 yds) £2.60,

and each subsequent 196.60m (215 yds) or uncompleted part thereof £0.20.

**4.3** TARIFF TWO - This charge applies to journeys undertaken between 11.00 pm and 7.00 am each day and all day Sunday with the exception of Public and Bank Holidays and the Christmas/New Year period.

The current Tariff Two is:-

If the distance does not exceed 137.16m (150 yds), for the whole distance£3.00.If the distance exceeds 137.16m (150 yds), for the first 137.16m (150 yds)£3.00,and each subsequent 160.02m (175 yds) or uncompleted part thereof£0.20.

The Tariff Two requested by SHCOA is:-

If the distance does not exceed 137.16m (150 yds), for the whole distance £3.00.

If the distance exceeds 137.16m (150 yds), for the first 137.16m (150 yds) £3.00,

and each subsequent 150.88m (165 yds) or uncompleted part thereof £0.20.

**4.4** TARIFF THREE- This charge applies to journeys undertaken from 6.00 pm on 24 December to 7.00 am on 27 December and 6.00 pm on 31 December to 7.00 am on 2 January and all day on other Public and Bank Holidays.

The current Tariff Three is: -

If the distance does not exceed 137.16m (150 yds), for the whole distance£4.00.If the distance exceeds 137.16m (150 yds), for the first 137.16m (150 yds)£4.00,and each subsequent 160.02m (175 yds) or uncompleted part thereof£0.20.

The Tariff Three requested by SHCOA is:-

If the distance does not exceed 137.16m (150 yds), for the whole distance£4.00.If the distance exceeds 137.16m (150 yds), for the first 137.16m (150 yds)£4.00,and each subsequent 150.88m (165 yds) or uncompleted part thereof£0.20.

6.1 The effects of the tariffs requested by SHCOA would be as shown in the tables below

## Tariff Three

The average percentage increase of the above is 2.72%

- 6.2 The rate of inflation as at January 2019 using the Consumer Price Index was 1.8%
- **6.3** Sunderland Hackney Carriage Operators' Association (SHCOA) have stated in their request that following consultation representatives of independent hackney carriage operators in Sunderland and Washington are in agreement with their request for an increase in the tariffs.
- **6.4** However, a letter has been received from Mr Michael Young, a representative of hackney carriage drivers in Sunderland stating that they are objecting to any increase in hackney carriage fares at this time. A copy of such letter enclosing a petition signed by 41 hackney carriage drivers is attached at Appendix 2.
- **6.5** Traditionally, the journey distance used for comparison purposes in reports of this nature is 2.5 miles. To that end, attached at Appendix 3 is a table showing the costs of a 2.5 mile journey on our current tariffs, those requested and those of neighbouring councils.
- **6.6** The Council is entitled to prescribe only the maximum fares that may be charged by hackney carriages. Any individual hackney carriage driver is free to charge less if s/he so chooses.

Following consultations with representatives of the Independent Hackney Carriage Operators in Sunderland and Washington operators, it has been agreed by the three groups to make a request to the Regulatory Committee to consider amendments to the Hackney Carriage fare tariff as follows: -

#### **TARIFF ONE:**

Monday to Saturday 7.00am to 11.00pm with the exception of Public and Bank Holidays and the Christmas & New Year period.

If the distance does not exceed 150 yards (137.16 metres)	
For the whole distance	£2.60
If the distance exceeds 150 yards (137.16 metres)	42100
For the first 150 yards (137.16 metres)	£2.60
Each subsequent 215 yards (196.60 metres)	
or uncompleted part thereof	£0.20
or uncompleted part thereof	£0.20

#### **TARIFF TWO:**

Monday to Saturday 11.00pm to 7.00am and all day Sunday with the exception of Public and Bank Holidays and the Christmas & New Year period.

If the distance does not exceed 150 yards (137.16 metres)	
For the whole distance	£3.00
If the distance exceeds 150 yards (137.16 metres)	
For the first 150 yards (137.16 metres)	£3.00
Each subsequent 165 yards (150.88 metres)	20100
or uncompleted part thereof	£0.20

#### **TARIFF THREE:**

6.3

From 6.00pm on 24<sup>th</sup> December to 7.00am on 27<sup>th</sup> December. From 6.00pm on 31<sup>st</sup> December to 7.00am on 2<sup>nd</sup> January and all day on other Public and Bank Holidays

If the distance does not exceed <u>150 yards</u> (137.16 metres)	
For the whole distance	£4.00
If the distance exceeds 150 yards (137.16 metres)

Each subsequent 165 yards (150.88 metres)

The proposed amendments only apply to the running mileage, with the flagfall on all three tariffs remaining the same.

#### FARES FOR TIME

Negotiated at the time of hiring.

#### WAITING TIME

It is proposed that the initial free waiting time of 126 seconds is removed, with each period of 60 seconds remaining the same at **£0.20** 

#### EXTRA CHARGES

For each adult in excess of two in number	£0.20
Each article of luggage (Wheelchairs and Pushchairs free of charge)	£0.20
Each dog or other animal (except accompanied Assistant Dogs)	£0.20
Summoning of vehicle where the hirer has been informed of the charge	£0.60
Fouling of the vehicle (Maximum Charge)	£60.00

We have sought to address the need to cover our increased operating costs without penalising the general public. In submitting this application, we have considered all factors; including increases in garage labour costs and parts, public hire insurance premiums, general running costs and an increase in living expenses due to inflation. As we represent drivers who operate over a twenty-four hours period, we feel that it is only fair that any increase applies to both Tariff One and Tariff Two.

It is once again with great reluctance that we are making this application, but it is felt that it is necessary under the current prevailing circumstances, and it is now over eighteen months since we last applied for an increase.

The average increase for the three tariffs equates to 2.9%, and as most journeys undertaken within the City of Sunderland are anywhere between one mile and five miles long, we feel that it is only fair to look at the average increase over these distances as follows: -

Due to the complexity of the formula to calculate increases on all three tariffs, it is almost impossible to have the same average increase on every tariff, as each 20p increase on the meter generates a fixed percentage increase.

As the representative for the Hackney Carriage drivers of Sunderland, I have been asked to lodge an objection to the tariff increase that has been proposed by the Sunderland Hackney Carriage association (Station Taxis).

Station Taxis claim it to be a request by the whole of the trade, however it is not. A large amount of Hackney Carriage operate under the rules set out for Hackney Carriages and only operate off official ranks and flag downs.

A tariff increase in the present economic climate would be damaging to our trade, which is struggling with the lack of custom in our city centre.

At no time has any organisation contacted us to discuss this matter as they know it would get a negative response.

Considering there has been no major increase in fuel costs or mechanical repair costs. We see no reasonable point for an increase.

A taxi to a lot of people is a luxury in the present economic climate and an increase would be damaging to the trade, therefore we strongly object to the proposed increase.
