Introduction to IAMP



What is it?



- The IAMP will create approximately 260,000m² of developable floorspace over a 100ha manufacturing park
- 5,200 new jobs by 2026 –
 500 p/a from 2019/20
- Focused on the Advanced Manufacturing sector

The City Deal



- Key component of Sunderland & South Tyneside's City Deal
- South Tyneside and Sunderland City Councils are working in partnership
- Secure a policy framework and consent and to assemble the required package of land and develop the infrastructure



How is it being progressed?



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
- Two distinct but overlapping processes
- Planning policy framework
 - Area Action Plan
 - Release the land from the Green Belt
- Planning Consent
 - 'Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project' (NSIP)
 - Consent secured through a Development Consent Order (DCO)
- Separation of tasks required by PINS

The Area Action Plan process



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- Issues and Options consultation early 2015
- Green Belt and Site Selection Options early 2016
- Publication Draft AAP current
- Full Council January 2017
- Submission to PINS Feb 2017
- Examination Summer 2017



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The Development Consent Order (DCO)

What is a DCO?

- Statutory instrument
- All encompassing consent and compulsory acquisition


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- Personal to IAMP LLP
- Front loaded consultation/engagement and design
- Liaison with PINS officers and Examining Authority
- Fixed periods for determination

DCO timescale



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Current tasks



- Creation and establishment of the Scheme Promoter vehicle
- Detailed masterplanning and design process
- Statutory consultation in October 2017
- Liaison with Highways England
- Preparation of draft DCO documentation
- Engagement with PINS
- Negotiation with landowners

Project Governance



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DCO is a new process for both Councils:

- Clear separation of roles and responsibilities
- Robustness to PINS/Government and the public
- DCO Scheme Promoter IAMP LLP
- Local Authority regulatory responsibilities
