
INTRODUCTION

Indicators Rated Amber:


Percentage of Referrals decided within 24 hours

Target: 95% Actual: 92.2%

Performance is slightly below target and rated amber. There were 20 referrals where a decision took longer than 24 hours but all 20 were decided within 3 days.

The service has confirmed that for the 20 referrals it was necessary to take more time to obtain all the required information, to make the right decision for the child. There are no concerns from the service regarding the performance.

TFC SUPPORTING MEASURES (CONTRACTUAL AND CITY PLAN)



Indicators Rated Amber:

<u>Proportion of Educational Health Care Plans issued in 20 weeks (Excluding Exception cases) – rated Amber</u>

Target: 65% Actual: 52.9%

Performance is below target and rated amber. Performance against this target has continued to stabalise over the past few months. The issues affecting the service earlier this year and the actions taken to address this have been reported to Board previously.

<u>Percentage of Cared for Children that have their statutory visit within Timescale – rated Amber</u>

Target: 95% Actual: 94.1%

Performance is slightly below target and rated amber. Senior Managers within Social Care receive regular reports to closely monitor this target closely to ensure children receive their statutory visits.










Performance is slightly below target and rated amber. There were 20 referrals where a decision took longer than 24 hours but all 20 were decided within 3 days.

Performance remains stable, as is lower (better) than target. There were 43 children that have had three or more home moves in the last 12 months.


Performance remains stable and above target, with 453 children having an education plan in place.









































































BLUE- % of care experienced young people in suitable accommodation (19-21) Period BLUE- % of care experienced young people who are in employment, education or training (19-21)
