1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 The purpose of this report is to outline the key elements of the Community Relationship Building and Engagement Strategy.

- 3.3 At the heart of this strategy is a need for our communities to have a real stake in how we work to support the most vulnerable individuals, to involve communities in our decision making, and to enable them to feel that they can help drive and improve the services that we deliver.
- 3.4 This strategy will outline how we will improve our ability to engage with our community and look at how we build relationships with vulnerable groups. This will include partnerships, internal and external communication, consultation and volunteering.
