Project Description: The application builds on a recent review of the Princess Anne Masterplan

The Area Committee aligned £50,000 Neighbourhood Investment Capital funding to deliver works identified as part of the review and Sunderland City Council also matched that with central capital funds of another £50,000 resulting in **£100,000** available. Ward Members subsequently identified repairs to footpaths and surfaces as the key priorities and Officers have now costed up and prioritised the list of those identified in the original review, focusing on those presenting the most risk re health and safety and complaints.

The attached plan highlights areas of hard surfacing/footpaths that need attention and are traffic lighted re priority

Red areas

Tarmac Resurface, strip existing wearing course $-2650m2 = \pounds 60,000$ Provide new signage to northern car park = $\pounds 5000$ Tarmac Resurface + Sub-base + Edging $-150m2 \times \pounds 50 = \pounds 7500$ Motorway Guard Fence - Repair fallen section 5m x $\pounds 50 = \pounds 250$ Brick Wall Removal $-35m = \pounds 500$ **Total = \pounds 73,250**

Amber items

Repair existing steps from northern carpark = \pounds 15,000 Bridge handrail fix – 3m of timber Railing = \pounds 250 **Grand total = \pounds88,500**

This leaves £11,500 for a contingency and preliminaries

A number of other items are also identified

- Tarmac with cracking and root ingress and beginnings of potholes Total area 3100m2 (This will probably need re-laying withing 10-15years)
- New path 1060m2
- Burn edging supporting structure 100m of wooden staked structure.
- Edges of Tarmac fallen away need of filing and reseeding 50m2
- Mud paths to have natural finish (gravel or bark) 4200m2
- Natural Paths wooden steps to be changed in coming years 50 steps
- Carpark resurfacing 50m2

Some items are identified as 'green' and non-urgent and some of those may be considered as part of Environmental Services usual maintenance and repair schedule. Progress to deliver the remaining activity proposed in the review will continue to be reported to the Board

Provided comprehensive feedback on why a heating system is needed and how it will benefit the current users and future programme delivery - "At present Washington Boxing Club has no heating system other than 2 x Large electrical heaters that were kindly donated to the Club. These unfortunately do not warm any parts of the building or help in the temperature overall. They are also extremely expensive to run. Providing a warm environment to train and conduct fitness is a priority. We have developed and improved all parts of the building and facility over the last few years, and we are now wishing to solve this problem."

Specific bespoke project which provides restoration facilities for its members and also hosts visits for a variety of groups. Links with a wide variety of groups including young people, heritage, uniformed groups. Have provided details on why the project of new lighting is required and how this will open up the facility for longer usage and also assist in reducing the carbon footprint and their aim of hosting overnight camping. NERC has a policy of continuous repair and improvement and whilst this is largely self-funded. Currently they have two major projects under consideration - to carry out wholesale replacement of the roof and to replace the lighting system to comply with current legislation and to satisfy the requirements of our insurers. The latter project is the subject of this application - to provide dedicated lighting circuitry throughout the buildings and to replace all neon strip lights with switched led strip lights. Also provision of sensor activated lights at strategic positions throughout. This work is to be carried out and certified professionally at a total cost of £16,000 with the balance funded from current reserves

On an evening it is a social space for many groups and at weekends hosts functions, activities and events. A new system will improve access, retain heat, reduce energy bills, provide privacy, offer additional room hire, and create a multipurpose space.
