HEALTH AND SAFETY REPORT

REPORT OF THE PORT DIRECTOR

1. Health & Safety Report

- 1.1 I have commissioned a full health and safety review of the Port requirements in relation to Port Premises and management of health and safety within the organisation. The review will be undertaken over a four week period and started week commencing 28 June 2010.
- 1.2 The review will be carried out by Lisa Charlton, Senior Health and Safety Adviser based within the Corporate Health and Safety Team.
- 1.2.1 The terms of reference of the review are to assess the suitability in current arrangements for the management of health and safety within the Port of Sunderland, specifically:
 - obtain a current position statement on compliance with health and safety requirements in relation to the Port
 - whether formal systems for identifying and controlling significant risks exist,
 - whether these are being followed by managers and employees and
 - identify areas of non compliance
 - prioritise the issues to be addressed
 - assist the Port Director to integrate the findings into an action plan which will form the monitoring tool for the Port health and safety improvement board
- 1.3 The review will involve a full inspection of premises under Port control, interviewing key people, observing activities, reviewing records critical incidents and existing management systems.
- 1.3.1 The audit criteria used will be Sunderland City Council health and safety policy and current Health and Safety Executive Approved codes of practice and guidance including:
 - The Docks Regulations 1988
 - The Workplace (Health, Safety and Welfare) Regulations
 - Health and Safety Guidance 136, Workplace Transport Safety, Guidance for Employees
 - Ports Skills and Safety

2. Recommendation

2.1 The Board is requested to note the contents of this report and agree to receive a further report on health and safety in due course once the audit is complete.
