Farringdon Community Sports College is a specialist sports college with a sports pavilion that has various facilities including a dance studio, computer suite, multi-use games area, meeting room and kitchen etc. SIB funding has been sought to promote better usage of the pavilion area at the school and to make the facilities already on offer, more accessible and available to parents, students and the wider community by contributing towards staffing and other related costs, to extend opening hours, provide opportunities to develop activities for young people during school holidays and evenings and to encourage other partner organisations such as the Jubilee Centre, SAFC and the A690 Youth Initiative Project to become involved. Over the last three months there have been 110 inductions and over 80 regular members attending the facilities. The tennis nets have been installed and the courts are available to the public every evening and a Saturday morning and the sports pavilion is up and running offering classes such as karate, yoga, dance, football training, tennis and keep fit. The project is ongoing.

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SIB funding has been sought to 'gate' Chelmsford Street, a private, non-adopted highway, by installing a fence and gate at either end of it, which will help to counter antisocial behaviour and vandalism by providing a secure fence line for the adjacent allotment site. Currently the plans for the erection of the metal fence, gate and brickwork were submitted to the City Council's Planning Department in March and the residents are awaiting a decision which is anticipated to be in June. Expenditure to date has been on planning and architects fees.

Portland School has developed and piloted a café within the school environment which is additional to the normal school meals provision, which has proved popular with staff, pupils and after school community use, as it offers healthy options and promotes healthy eating at an affordable price. The project through the help of SIB funding will undertake a programme of capital works and expand the cafe to ensure it can deliver the school's extended and community services and continue to offer healthy eating options. It is hoped that once the expansion is complete the cafe facility will enable students to learn appropriate social skills in a safe setting before transferring those skills to the community. Along with helping the students it is also hoped that the wider community will also benefit from the increased facilities by educating and informing them about the importance of diet, exercise and lifestyle. This will be done by the installation of a computer fed TV in the cafe. Work is scheduled to commence in the school summer holidays and will be completed by the beginning of the new term in September.

This innovative 'Body Worn Video Unit' technology project, is intended to add operational, preventive, proactive, reassurance and criminal justice based value to the wider role of the South Area Neighbourhood Policing Team. It is anticapted that through the help of SIB funding to purchase four 'Body Worn Video Units - Head Cams' and two viewing units, that it will positively impact on the service delivery provided to residents and visitors to the area. The 'Head Cams' are a personal CCTV system, with a thumb sized camera attached to a headband linked to a digital video recorder, which has an easy to view LCD screen and hard drive, allowing instant playback of footage at crime scenes and permits storage of around 400 hours of footage which can be used in prosecutions.
