

Executive Summary: Recommendation to Approve

Project Description

In 2008 the Authority purchased twenty-four 3G cameras which were to be part of the Safer Sunderland Strategy through the Local Multi-Agency Partnership (LMAP). The Security Team within Land and Property Services are part of the LMAP partnership and are wholly responsible for the management of this system. These cameras are designed to be re-locatable onto 10metre lighting columns and with the assistance of Balfour Beatty we move the cameras as and when required at the request of the LMAP group to 'hotspot' locations to monitor Anti-Social Behaviour, to provide community safety and reassurance.

As part of the management process and to ensure a viable asset programme, as faults occur cameras are sent to Wireless CCTV for repair. As these cameras are coming up to twelve years old and subsequently, we are experiencing a number of failures, which has resulted in the camera being noted as, 'beyond economical repair'. To which the camera must be replaced, an agreement has been reached to 'trade-in' the defunct camera to Wireless CCTV to be replaced by new 4G High Definition Mini-Domes with blue light at a cost of £3,500 each, which is £1,000 cheaper than purchasing a new camera. This price also includes the standard two years airtime and two years warranty.

The Neighbourhood and Community Area Board are proposing to replace two cameras and purchase one new camera for sole use across the East area, which will be managed by the East LMAPs process.
