WASHINGTON EXTENDED LIBRARY SERVICE

REPORT OF DIRECTOR OF COMMUNITY AND CULTURAL SERVICES

1.0 PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

- 1.1 Following the closure of Washington Town Centre library for a major refurbishment in February 2008, other library services in Washington were enhanced to support the development.
- 1.2 Washington Green Library extended opening times to include all day Wednesday and Thursday, which are the days when the library is usually closed.
- 1.3 Washington Millennium Centre Library extended opening times to include all day Wednesday and Saturday afternoon, which are the times when the library is usually closed.
- 1.4 One of the mobile libraries is also timetabled to visit areas of Washington not covered in the current timetable.

2.0 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 Staff from Washington Town Centre Library are being utilised to cover the extra opening hours at both Washington Green and Washington Millennium Centre libraries.
- 2.2 The mobile routes have been altered to accommodate the extra stops in the wider Washington area.

3.0 CURRENT POSITION

- 3.1 Washington Green has increased its opening hours by 13 hours per week. (52 per month).
- 3.2 Issues have increased by an average of 682 per month = 39 % increase. (Appendix 1)
- 3.3 Business has increased not only on the days usually closed, but also on normal opening days.
- 3.4 Washington Millennium Centre has increased its opening hours by 10 hours per week. (40 per month)
- 3.5 Issues have increased by an average of 914 per month, 22% increase and business has increased over the whole week, not just over the extra opening days. (Appendix 2)

- 3.6 The mobile library visits new stops in the Washington area on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.
- 3.7 Issues have been double the average at the Tuesday and Thursday stops. However the Wednesday stop is not as popular so investigations are underway to locate a more suitable and accessible venue. (Appendix 3)
- 3.8 A library service is also offered from the Conference room at Washington Leisure Centre which is proving popular with existing library users and leisure centre users.
- 3.9 The service offers books, DVD's, CD's, newspapers, magazines and public access PC's. (Appendix 4)

4.0 PROPOSED NEXT STEPS

- 4.1 The library service maintains a temporary library service in Washington Leisure Centre for the duration of the refurbishment.
- 4.2 The extended services at other venues in Washington have proved to be popular with Washington Town Centre customers and existing customers at Washington Green and Washington Millennium Centre and should be retained.
