'As we head once more from Autumn to Winter, we can already see the effect the weather is having on the road surfaces around the city. With heavy rain and imminent frost penetrating the surfaces and creating potholes and loose material, which creates a hazard to all road users, can the portfolio holder confirm the following:

- 1. Damaged road surfaces across the city will be prioritised for repair over the winter period to keep road users safe.
- 2. The council has a fully costed plan to ensure road surfacing repairs will be carried out in a timely manner in the future.'
