- In relation to the Sunderland Schools' local funding formula, the Sunderland Schools' Forum recommended Cabinet be requested to approve the following principles be implemented for the 2021/2022 Sunderland local funding formula:
 - The National Funding Formula (NFF), made up of fifteen different funding elements, to be implemented with the following local adjustments, which were modelled in detail so as to give the most equitable settlement possible to all Sunderland schools whilst moving towards the NFF:
 - The Minimum Funding Guarantee applied at 2.0% in line with the NFF value:
 - The Free School Meal proxy indicator set at a rate of £319.52 per pupil (NFF £460); (NB: alongside the Minimum Funding Guarantee, this proxy indicator does not reduce the funds available to schools for meals),
 - A transfer of 0.5% (£890,842) to the High Needs Block in recognition of ongoing pressures.

Reasons for decision:

- (ii) The proposed scheme, the main features which are as set out at Appendix A, reflects the experience of the impact of the scheme to date and is seen to be a fair and affordable scheme for low-income residents.
